




# PEACHTREE STREET DEMONSTRATION PROJECT

We've been redesigning a portion of Peachtree Street as a shared space that will create an exceptional public space in Downtown Atlanta by putting people first. To help us make better decisions about the design, we're testing what's possible with a demonstration project. Starting this summer, three blocks between Baker Street and Ellis Street will change temporarily to make more space for people and test how this works with vehicles, helping inform the final shared space design.



## Phase 1

To start, we're seeing what would happen if we reallocated some space for vehicles to other modes and public space. Phase 1 will have one travel lane in each direction, expanded pedestrian areas and a new mid-block crossing. This will use **simple paint striping and planters to test and monitor how the new layout works.** Keeping it minimal for now makes it easy to adjust. This part will last a few months.

This test will happen in phases, allowing us to see what works, get input from the community, and adjust the final design. **We're in Phase 1 now.**



## Phase 2

Later this summer, we will adjust the layout if needed and upgrade with features like paint, temporary landscaping, and outdoor furniture to **activate the expanded public space.** This will stay until we are ready to construct the final design.



## Phase 3

The final design will be an **inviting and beautiful shared, curbside space** with plaza-style pavers, fresh landscaping, outdoor seating, and art, where people can cross throughout the street. Cars will be allowed at slow speeds in a space that's about two lanes wide, which is why we're testing how two lanes would work in Phase 1.
